LEGISLATIVE RESOLUTION 463

OT MONTH PROCLAMATION

Recognizing the value of occupational therapy in Nebraska.

Introduced April 3 to the 109th Legislature of Nebraska by Senator Lynne Walz



Supporting legislation to remove Multiple Procedure Payment Reduction for therapies. Although the bill did not gain traction to pass, advocacy efforts were positive.

Meetings with leadership from PT and speech associations to strengthen relationships.

Meeting with ABA representatives to give feedback on their licensure bill.

Beginning the process to update our scope of practice. Application is submitted and meetings have started to plan for legislation in 2026.
